From the Director's Chair *"The Value of Community Hospice Care"*

The purpose of Community Hospice Care is to increase the significance of a terminal patient's remaining days through the provision of an umbrella of physical care, emotional support, and encouragement to the patient's ability to remain in the home setting for as long as possible.

For many terminal patients, seeking hospice isn't about giving up hope or hastening death, but rather a way to get the most appropriate care in the last phase of life. Hospice care represents a compassionate approach to end-of-life care, enhancing the quality of remaining life and enabling you to live as fully and as comfortable as possible. Hospice care has been shown to make people who have incurable illnesses feel better and live longer. Enrolling in hospice care early might help you or your loved one develop a strong relationship with the hospice staff, who can help with preparation for end-of-life needs.

Hospice is an option for people whose life expectancy is six months or less. Hospice enables you to live your last days to the fullest, with purpose, dignity, grace and support. This enables you to spend your final days in a comfortable environment, surrounded by your loved ones who can focus more fully on you with the support of hospice staff. If your doctor has certified your prognosis as six months or less, you are eligible for hospice. This applies to anyone of any age, with any type of illness. As well as cancer patients, people with ALS, kidney disease, and Alzheimer's disease, for example, can also benefit greatly from hospice care. Alzheimer's disease, in particular, is often overlooked for hospice referral because of its slow progression. People with Alzheimer's are usually referred to hospice when they are in the final stages of the illness, which can be very helpful to family members even if the person can no longer communicate.

Some families who do choose hospice care often do so only for the last few days of life, and later regret not having

more time saying goodbye to their loved one. To ensure that your family understands your wishes, it's important for anyone with a life-limiting illness to learn all they can about hospice and discuss their feelings with loved ones before a medical crisis occurs. When your loved ones are clear about your preferences for treatment, they're free to devote their energy to care and compassion.

Hospice care focuses on all aspects of a patient's life and well-being: physical, social, emotional, and spiritual. There is no age restriction; anyone in the late stages of life is eligible for hospice services. Hospice provides an interdisciplinary team, or IDT, that includes the patient's physician, a hospice doctor, a case manager, registered nurses, a counselor, a dietician, therapist, pharmacist, social workers, a minister, and various trained volunteers. The hospice team develops a care plan designed to the patient's individual need for pain management and symptom relief, and provides all the necessary medications for pain and symptom control pertinent to the terminal diagnosis, medical supplies and equipment. Hospice IDT members make regular visits to assess the patient and provide additional care and services, such as speech and physical therapy, Massage & Healing Touch / Reiki Therapy, or dietary assistance. Certified home health aides may also help with bathing and other personal care services. Hospice staff remains on-call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. A hospice IDT also provides emotional and spiritual support according to the needs, wishes, and beliefs of the patient. Emotional and spiritual support is also provided to the person's loved ones as well, including grief counseling.

Hospice can reduce anxiety in both the terminally ill patient and his or her family by helping them make the most of the time remaining and achieve some level of acceptance. In addition to focusing on the physical health and comfort of a patient, hospice care also focuses on the emotional needs and spiritual well-being of the



terminally ill and their loved ones. Since a hospice program offers substantial support and training for family caregivers, it also helps many patients feel less of a burden to their loved ones.

The following services are also provided by Community Hospice Care: Caregiver education, Bereavement for 14 months after death; counseling, newsletters, support groups, extensive library resources, "Exploring Life's Changes" Youth Camp, Annual Memorial Service, Volunteer Services (Visiting with patients/families when requested, Assisting with light housekeeping duties, courier duties, Life Review and the Watchman Program.

Families often call us for information about hospice care and then feel more comfortable in bringing up the subject with the doctor. Other times, we often contact the doctor on behalf of the patient and family, and inquire as to the appropriateness of hospice care. Community Hospice Care admits most patients into the program the same day we receive a request to do so. We have no waiting list. We make every effort to schedule admissions at the family's convenience, including evenings, weekends and holidays. Men and Grief: Busting Myths 3 & 4 to Reveal the Truth

In the last section of this three part series on male grief we focused on two myths, which were that men should be able to shake off the loss of a loved one and that they should be able to keep their emotions on a tight leash even when grieving. This section will discuss two more myths regarding male grief.

It is a myth that men should not grieve because they need to be strong for everyone else. There is nothing wrong with being supportive or even being the pillar of strength for the family sometimes, but this myth influences the male to strive for this role all the time. If the male attempts to be this pillar of strength all the time he will never have the time to actually grieve his loved one. The issue is that society questions the masculinity of any man that shows weakness, but if one pretends to be strong all the time their grief will be suppressed. This will cause the grief to be shoved deeper within the man and his physical and psychological health will suffer.

The final Myth for discussion is that men should only grieve when they are alone. Asking for help while grieving is only an issue because again it has men questioning their masculinity, but leaning on others is not a gender oriented action. In fact having a community of support to lean on is often essential to the grieving process. Sometimes social support is even the only way to regain the strength to continue facing grief. Hopefully now that you (the reader) have seen the truth behind these myths you can advocate for eliminating some of the pressure of male stereotypes that keep them from being fully human.

As men it is important for us to realize that grieving is neither masculine nor feminine, it is human and suppressing it will only make it harder to work through. As loved ones of grieving men we must also not reinforce these myths, but advocate for the truth so that they can grieve without unnecessary pressures weighing them down. There are many myths in this world, but the ones revolving around grieving men must be busted so that their grief does not slowly kill them. Men and women cannot avoid grief and the only way to face it is to embrace it, not hide from it. It must be reiterated that the discussion on the myths of male grieving could not have been done without Carol Staudacher's book Men and Grief.
